- (c) Title
- (d) ECTS credit value
- (e) Applicable mark scheme (either PGS - Percentage/Grade Mark Scheme
or PFM - Pass/Fail Mark Scheme)
- (f) Study-unit type, according to codes below:

1. Heading: the area of study, indicating if main, honours or subsidiary
2. Year of programme
3. Compulsory and elective study-units offered during sem 1 & 2 (ie continuing study-units)
4. Compulsory and elective study-units offered during sem 1
5. Compulsory and elective study-units offered during sem 2
(Note: In the case of elective units, please indicate the number of credits that must be chosen from the list.)
6. Optional units that may be taken (In Year 1 sem 1, students are not allowed to take any optional units.)
7. The number of credits that must be taken in the other area of study (if applicable).
8. Total credits to be obtained during the year (60 credits) with credits to be obtained in each of the areas of study taken.)

Dissertation	10 credits	20 ECTS

Law credits are to be chosen from those offered in the Magister Juris in European Studies. The final mark of the study-unit consists of 60% weighting for the examination and 40% weighting for the course work.
